ANZAC Centenary projections

On Friday 17 April City Hall will be transformed into an emotive tribute to our servicemen and women in a special lighting projection commemoration to mark the ANZAC centenary.

The above artist's impression from Matt Bonner, who has been selected to develop this significant project, is one of a series that will be projected onto City Hall.

"We are particularly delighted as Matt is a local film-maker and projection artist who has a keen interest in enriching people's understanding of Geelong history and the ANZAC story," Geelong Mayor Darryn Lyons said.

The light projections will honour the men and women who served during World War I. They have been designed for City Hall as an evocative memorial of the ANZAC legacy.

The ANZAC projections will be launched at a special event at 5pm on Friday 17 April and will involve two Light Horsemen carrying the RSL commemorative flame.

"We wanted to do something really special this year to acknowledge the ANZAC centenary," Mayor Lyons said.

"It will be an incredibly powerful lighting projection show that will pay tribute to all those who fought for the freedom we enjoy today."

"We're expecting thousands to attend the lighting projection shows that will run every night for two weeks between 6pm and midnight from Friday 17 April to Sunday 3 May," the Mayor said.

Veteran Affairs portfolio holder Cr Stretch Kontelj said Council had worked closely with the Geelong RSL Sub-Branch to deliver the lighting projections.

"The Geelong RSL Sub-Branch has been involved right from the outset and I'm really proud of the final product. It's a very fitting and moving tribute to the ANZAC legacy."

"We've got a big launch planned and we'd love to see as many people as we can there," Cr Kontelj said.

ANZAC Centenary June Competition

June competition is about the Anzac Centenary.

The date of the landing at ANZAC, the 25th April was chosen to be the day that would be the day that would become our national day of commemoration.

Initially, ANZAC Day was a mark of respect for those who served and sacrificed their lives in the Great War for Civilisation, the war as many hoped, to end all wars. The word ANZAC was approved by General Birdwood as the code for the Corps, when the word was proposed by a Major CM Wagstaff. It is thought the suggestion came from Lt AT White of the RASC. It is recorded in the official history that "it was some time before the code word came into general use, and at the landing (25th April 1915) many men in the divisions had not heard of it". After the landing, General Birdwood gained permission to use the name for the area occupied by the Australian and New Zealand Forces.

<u>Guidelines</u> the June competition. It can be a photo of the Anzac day march this year, individuals that have served, children wearing medals from their families (just make sure they wear them on the right hand side, you can only wear them on the left if they belong to you), memorials, statues depicting war service, anything that you think evokes Anzac Day ie: tin of Anzac Day biscuits, ration packs, nurses, Artillery pieces etc.
