

Each image must be named in the format below, using an underscore between each section of the file name:

Open Competition entries: yyyymm_Title_nnn_OP.jpg Set Subject entries: yyyymm_Title_nnn_SS.jpg

Example of image naming protocol: 201109_My Image_009_SS

yyyymm	Year and month (eg 201109 = September 2011 competition)
Title	Image title (multi-word titles may include spaces between words)
nnn	Member's three digit competition number (for numbers below 100, examples of numbering are: 009; 032)
ОР	Open entry with no set subject for the monthly competition as set out in the Syllabus
SS	Set subject for the month

Please also double check that the month used in the title is the month of the competition, which may not be the month of uploading.







The Art of Street Photography

Getting great pictures of street theatre, performance artists, buskers and musicians does not require any special equipment, but you will need quick reflexes, and the skill to anticipate the action.

Performers are never worried about cameras, most are extroverts and love being photographed. Some will even ask if they can get some emailed copies of your shots. I generally oblige them but only send low resolution files and offer them higher resolution shots on request.

A friend of mine sent off pictures to a musician only to see it appear on the cover of his CD without even a photographer's credit.

My 'street' kit is uncomplicated: Nikon DSLR with 80-200mm lens and a mirrorless Fujifilm X-pro 1 with 60mm lens.

I usually have the shutter speed set to continuous but only fire off a couple of frames in bursts to capture a high-energy band or an over-expressive actor. Flash should be avoided though. It kills the atmosphere, is a major distraction for actors and annoying for musicians.





FACIAL EXPRESSIONS CAN HAPPEN QUICKLY. SHOOT A FEW QUICK PICS AND REVIEW LATER.

With street buskers, try and include some of the people watching the performance. Often audience expressions can be just as good as the busker. I usually have the shutter speed set to continuous but only fire off a couple of frames in bursts to capture a high-energy band or an over-expressive actor. Flash should be avoided though. It kills the atmosphere, is a major distraction for actors and annoying for musicians.

A zoom lens is essential to get a variety of compositions particularly if you are in a big crowd. Try and move your vantage point often. Be polite and considerate of other people as you move among the crowd to get better picture angles and try not to bang someone in the ear with your tele lens.

Watch for actors and musicians who display lots of facial expressions and avoid the 'cool' muso that plays with his eyes closed or wears sunglasses. The music might be in the groove but the pictures will be lifeless. In any people shots, big black sunglasses hide the eyes.

Best places for buskers and performers are Melbourne CBD and Southgate on weekends.

Some of the best festivals across the Geelong region include Pako Festa, Portarlington Mussel Festival, Highland Gathering, Bellarine Busker Competition at Point Lonsdale and Queenscliff Music Festival offer great opportunities to capture buskers, musicians and street performers.





Tip: Shoot lots – shoot often, you will be pleasantly surprised at the variety of results, and get that busker to pop those sunnies up on their head.








These amazing images were lightpainted by the pixelstick, appearing floating in the air, and only the complete images are seen via a long exposure in the camera.
