done a fantastic job and has now handed over the baton to Sue O'Connor who I am sure will keep the standard high. Thank you Sue for taking on the job.


We have some exciting guest speakers arranged in the next few months and I urge members to continue to submit competition entries to win that elusive Image of the Competition title.

# ocean grove photos phot

Your monthly photography tip from Ocean Grove Camera & Photo: SETTING THE CORRECT ISO

ISO relates to your sensor's ability to capture light. A high ISO will allow you to capture more light in challenging lighting conditions, however too often I see this used to the detriment of image quality. In my opinion, boosting the ISO on your DSLR should be seen as a last resort to protect the image from noise. There are several other options you have at your disposal before shifting the ISO. Consider exactly what you are trying to achieve with your image. For example, are you able to throw more light on to your subject in order to use a faster shutter speed rather than boosting ISO. Of course, there are always situations where a higher ISO is necessary, but in my experience it is better to you should be more focussed on getting the cleanest image possible. Using your camera on AUTO mode will almost always deliver an ISO that is too high as image sharpness is usually the priority in AUTO mode. Using at least PROGRAM (P) mode will enable you to control the

ISO. All cameras handle ISO differently, so I encourage photographers to find their camera's ISO "sweet spot". In other words, find a darkened scene to shoot and take the photo at numerous ISO settings to see where the image becomes too noisy and therefore unusable. Most crop sensored DSLRs will begin to struggle at 800 to 1600 ISO. Full frame cameras will generally have a greater tolerance to higher ISO settings due to the better spread of pixels on the sensor which gives them a lower signal to noise ratio.

Of course, with everything in photography there are no set rules as to which ISO setting you should use. Some images are actually improved with the grainy texture a higher ISO can deliver. But I still recommend you find out exactly what you camera ISN'T capable of before you head out into the field. Cheers and happy shooting!





# CAMERA SETTINGS FOR NIGHT SHOTS WITHOUT FLASH

Subject	ISO	Aperture	Shutter
Fireworks	100	f5.6	5 secs
Light trails, eg traffic along a freeway	100	f8	10-20 secs
Drawing with torch in low light	100	f5.6	30 secs
Bonfire	100	f5.6	1/8 <sup>th</sup> sec
Well-lit shop window	100	f5.6	1/15 <sup>th</sup> sec
Flood-lit monuments	100	f5.6	2 secs
Full moon landscape	100	f5.6	2 min
Well-lit stage	100	f5.6	1/15 <sup>th</sup> sec

- Use tripod at all times
- If you want to increase your exposure time for effect, change aperture to say f8 or f11
- To decrease exposure, increase ISO up to 1600 but noise also increases


