INTRODUCTION

Our club is a keen group of people who enjoy a positive and friendly environment, and share an avid interest in photography. Our aim is to provide opportunities for all members to learn and improve their photographic skills regardless of their level of experience.

In joining our club you have demonstrated that you have an interest in and love of photography, or that you are keen to learn more about the wonderful world of photographic imaging and sharing ideas with other club members. Whatever your level of expertise, Bellarine Camera Club welcomes you.

MEETINGS

Bellarine Camera Club meets twice a month - the first and third Monday of the month (no meeting in January), at SpringDale Neighbourhood Centre, 17-21 High Street, Drysdale. Meetings commence at 7.30pm.

All members and visitors must sign the attendance register as they arrive; this is required for insurance purposes. A visitor as a prospective member is welcome to attend two meetings after which a membership fee would be payable.

Member name badges are provided and are to be worn at meetings to enable new members to get to know current members.

As a courtesy to our speakers, judges and fellow members, all members are asked to switch their mobile phones to silent, or turn them off during meetings. If a call must be taken in an emergency, members are requested to take the call outside the meeting hall.

The first meeting of the month typically consists of a speaker or demonstrator on various aspects of photography and a presentation of his/her work.

The second meeting of the month is judging night, when images that have been assessed by an appointed judge are presented to the meeting. Images are either mounted on display panels or, if digital, projected onto a screen. The judge analyses each image, giving reasons for the verdict, and awards merit certificates to those images considered deserving. The judge may also present some of his/her own work for discussion and comment to round out the evening. Competition print entries for the following month's competition are due at this meeting; digital images (EDIs) to be uploaded on the same day via the website, found under the Competitions tab.

There are some non-competition outings arranged for those who may be available during the week and occasionally weekends for a casual, common-interest day. Members are notified of these on our members only Facebook page.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

Membership fees are paid annually and are due 1st July each year.

Fees (Annual):

- \$50.00 Ordinary Members
- \$90.00 Family (two adult members & dependent children under 18yrs in the same household)
- \$40.00 Concession / Student (Concession is for Government Pension Card holders)
- \$25.00 Members who join after 31st December

COMMITTEE

Our club financial year runs from 1st July to 30th June. Our Annual General Meeting is held in August when the new committee for the upcoming year is elected. Should you have any queries or require further information, please contact any of the committee members – see website for contact details.

BECOMING A MEMBER

To become a member, a Membership Application form is to be completed and can be handed to the Membership Secretary at the next meeting – a Membership Application form can be obtained from our website under the “Member Information” tab, or from the Membership Secretary at a meeting.

The Membership Secretary will allot a competition number when the application form has been processed. New members are eligible to enter monthly competitions as soon as their competition number has been advised to them.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Club members are required to be respectful and tolerant of other people's point of view and interests, including speakers, judges and fellow club members. It is the diversity of our membership that provides interesting points of view, techniques and images to share.

Club members should at all times aim to include all members in activities, conversations and opportunities to maintain a harmonious inclusive environment for all members.

Safety of our members and the public must always be a priority for members. BCC members are required to be mindful of hazards and the environment around them and perform all activities in a safe and acceptable way. All equipment used by the club must be fit for purpose and routinely checked from a safety perspective, with any defects corrected.

SYLLABUS

Our current syllabus (annual program), which runs from February to December each year, can be found on our website under the "What's On" tab. It may be helpful to plan your photography ahead for the set subjects to minimise any last-minute rush. Our syllabus is updated from time to time so a regular visit to our website is recommended.

The Committee will determine the syllabus for the forthcoming six or possibly twelve months. Members are encouraged to suggest ideas for set subjects for consideration by the Committee in the preparation of the next syllabus. Ideas can be given to any committee member at a meeting.

CLUB COMPETITIONS

Club competitions are designed to improve the photography of members by encouraging submissions of their photographs for assessment by nominated judges.

Club competitions are held once a month and each competition is divided in to two categories:

- Prints
- EDI (Electronic Digital Image), which is projected on to a screen.

Each monthly competition is nominated as either:

- Open (OP) - any subject of the member's choice, or
- Set Subject (SS) - a nominated subject as per the syllabus

The syllabus, which can be found on our website under the "What's On" tab, sets out the timetable and competition subjects, including set subject definitions.

Monthly competitions are run for two grades of proficiency: A Grade, for more experienced photographers and B Grade for novice or new photographers.
