A NOTE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

I've just returned from 5 weeks in Western Australia. What a huge state this is. Firstly I did a trip down the Canning Stock Route. This route was through the Great Sandy Desert, the Gibson Desert and the Little Sandy Desert. It was originally surveyed by Alfred Canning, and opened in 1911 so that cattle from the east side of the Kimberley could be brought down to Wiluna be sold. It was planned so that there was no longer than a day's walk between water wells. There were only 20 droves that took place down this route between 1931 and 1959. The route had a checked history with disputed and mistreatment of the local aboriginal people.

Today it is seen as one of the great four wheel drive experiences. The track is not maintained and has lots of corrugations, rocky areas and numerous sand dunes. A few of the wells have been restored and you can get water from them. Everything else you have to carry with you.

The colours of the desert are amazing and the scenery changes constantly, from sand dunes to rocky mountains to salt lakes and clay pans. And the stars are amazing. This is definitely the place for astrophotography.

Whilst taking photos on trips like this can be very challenging, they still represent memories of where I've been. Yes, they are out of focus as they were taken from a moving vehicle or the windows were dusty. Hopefully there will be some good ones amongst the hundreds taken.

Remember that taking photos is about creating memories, whether it is a holiday or family events etc. It's important to try to get the best image possible but not all are for judging and competitions. Take photos for yourself and be your own critic, trying to improve all the time.

* The 'Kodak Moment' – you must remember the commercial, don't you? Popularly known as Kodak, the Eastman Kodak Company that was founded in 1888 by George Eastman and by 1976, the company captured 90% of market share in terms of sales of photographic films in US. [Wikipedia]
* Kodak was really slow to make a transition into digital photography and by late 90s, even the sale of photographic films dropped so significantly that Kodak almost became bankrupt. In 2012 (January), the company filed for bankruptcy protection as per Chapter 11 of US bankruptcy law and was forced to sell several of its patents at a price of \$525 million to companies like HTC, Adobe Systems, Samsung, Microsoft, Amazon, Facebook, Google and Apple by 2013. This helped the company to emerge from bankruptcy on September 4, 2013. [Wikipedia]
