

The story behind the image

Neil has recently joined the club and won Image of the Competition for the February Open Competition.

Neil explains how this impressive low key image was created:

mid-The image was taken morning in full sunlight across a waterhole in southern Africa from a hide (a large steel shipping container partly sunken in the ground). It was taken with automatic exposure metering and there was considerable done post processing. Most of this was done in Lightroom, with finishing done Photoshop. I have printed this image on various media, but the best result was on a Baryta type stock, as that paper is designed for black and white images.

This is a technique that only works well for high contrast subjects such as the zebra. The inspiration came via my wife when she saw some high key and low key images printed on canvas and admired their simplicity.

Image of the Year 2022

The 2022 Image of the Year is chosen by a judge who reviews all the first and second place winning entries for the year. The winner for last year was Gordon Barfield for his "Nature's Textures".

- A tip from Andrews notes last week:

Auto Focus Lock (AF-ON) / Back Button Focus

There are situations where you need to take multiple shots of a subject (for example portraits) which is off-center. The most common method to do so is to either select a specific focal point or to use your center focal point to achieve focus and then recompose. That becomes tedious pretty quickly, not to mention error-prone when you need to act quickly to catch a moment, for example at weddings. Using back button focusing or auto focus lock you can skip the refocusing, as long as you're careful to keep the same distance to the subject, especially when shooting with a wide aperture (and therefore narrow depth of field).

There are multiple options to set your DSLR up for back button focusing, depending on your model.
